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### INTRODUCTION

Starting in **April 2025**, the Physis Scotland **Certificate in Group Work** course will be delivered online over 6 days of interactive and experiential training, over a 3-month period.

This certificate is designed for those interested in developing their understanding and skill in facilitating groups and training. It is of particular value for those in the helping professions including therapists, counsellors, coaches, mental health workers, social workers HR managers, service leads and teachers and all other caring professionals who facilitate or are interested in facilitating groups in a range of settings from organisations to different teams, to independent practice.

The 3 modules will integrate theory with experiential learning activities and group discussion and reflection plus opportunities to practice group facilitation. Although routed in theory and research, the thread running through this certificate will be practical ways for using our leaning to better support groups.

The certificate is suitable for practitioners from any modality who are already in practice, from trainees in advanced training to seasoned practitioners.

We will meet online over a 3-month period and there will be plenty of space for play, experiential learning and group process. There will be an emphasis on application to practice through skills work, observed practice and supervision, as well as an opportunity for integration with a broad range of theoretical concepts from a range of approaches.



On completion of this Certificate course, you will have:

- Developed your capacity to understand and work with groups.
- Be able to apply different theories of groupwork to your particular setting/s.
- Be able to use a range of facilitation and leadership approaches in your groupwork.
- A clear and confident understanding of your style of group facilitation and how to use your Self to support group process.
- Learned about the norms and roles in groups and develop your way of working with these.
- A deeper understanding of unconscious group processes and how to work with them.
- An understanding of the developmental process of the group and the leadership tasks at each stage.
- Increased your knowledge of the 'I' in the 'we' and the 'we' in the 'I', that is, issues of individuation, autonomy, and interdependence to be managed in the group development process.
- Explored group dynamics and how these impact group process.
- Critically assessed different types of groups and the considerations and clinical implications for each.
- An understanding of how to be an ethical and safe practitioner when working with groups.

# **COURSE STRUCTURE**

The Certificate consists of three taught modules over three weekends and one assessment.

#### Module One: Forming

- Modelling the beginning stages of group formation as we form our group
- Origins of group process in TA
- Imagoes and Multiplicity of Self
- Group Contracting
- Styles, Types, and Practical implications for group work
- Leadership and other group roles

#### Module Two: Storming

- Group development stages modelled and taught
- Autonomy and Homonomy
- Group Process
- Ruptures, Repairs and Shame in group process
- Power, responsibility, and ethics
- Skills Practice

#### Module Three: Performing

- Group Process
- Social Learning Theory, Neuroplasticity, and Change management



- How to write about groups
- Skills practice
- Group learning, feedback, approaches
- Integration and termination

#### Central threads running throughout:

- Attention to and learning from our live group process, and the use of modelling
- Ethical thinking
- The unconscious process of groups, games and missed invitations
- Practical skills development

#### ASSESSMENT

You will be given written feedback based on the tutor's assessment of your skills practice in Module 3. Following attendance of all three modules and participation in skills practice, you will receive a Certificate in Group Work from Physis Scotland.

#### FEES

Certificate fee: £655 (Inc. VAT) (3 taught modules over 3 weekends). £175 nonrefundable deposit plus  $3 \times \pm 160$  if self-funding. If you are being sponsored through your organisation, the fee is  $\pm 1015$  (Inc. VAT).  $\pm 175$  non-refundable deposit plus the remaining balance before the commencement of the course. Please note, if your sponsoring organisation is a charity, the course fee is  $\pm 655$ (Inc. VAT).

A deposit as indicated above is required to secure your place. The balance may be paid in full 1 week before the start of the course, or spread over 3 instalments if self-funding, paid in April, May and June. Please complete the



appropriate section of the registration form to take up the instalment payments option.
